Reflection: Love and the Cross *by Brother Paul Orosz* As I continue my Lenten journey, I often focus meditating on the crucifix. My fixation on the crucifix probably started when attending grade school at St. Stephen's where we participated in daily mass. Back then, when walking into church not only did the sanctuary and the altar draw your attention but also the huge crucifix affixed to one of the large pillars on the front right side of the church. Although many years have passed since then, I still meditate on what part I played in His crucifixion. Did the Romans kill Him? The Jews? Or did I have some responsibility because I am a sinner? While all of us share in that responsibility, this loving God forgives us if we repent. He loved us so much that He suffered and died for us.

Near the conclusion of the Last Supper the Lord said to his disciples, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:34-35)

The love that the Lord wants His disciples (and that includes us) to have is much different from romantic love or even brotherly love we have between friends and family. The Greek word that John used in Jesus' command is agape – God's kind of love that expects nothing in return. That was the kind of love that Jesus showed to His disciples when He "poured water into a basin and began to wash the feet of His disciples (v.5). That is the kind of love He displayed when He went to the cross for us.

During this Lent, look for someone to whom you can show such unselfish love. Who knows? It could become habit forming. Pray about it.

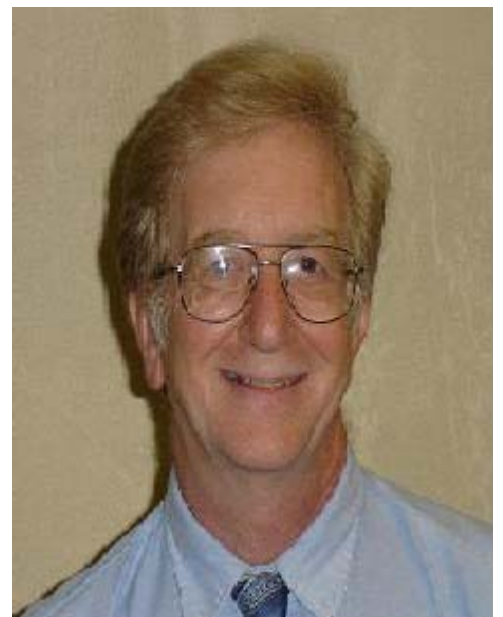
